The inaugural session of the Sport Coach USA Training Center will be held at Smith College on July 14, 15 & 16. Located just north of Springfield, Massachusetts in the town of Northampton., Smith has agreed to host the Center as a natural outreach component to its NCACE Level 4 certified graduate program in sports coaching education.

The Institute is working with its Smith partner, the Exercise & Sport Program

to offer the following coaching education courses and seminars:

- Coaching Principles
- Sport First Aid
- Inside the Sport Coaches Union
- USA Swimming Coaches School

Smith College and the Institute plan on this being an annual event and to expand the course offerings in 2007 and beyond.

It has been through the vision of Smith Professor Don Siegel, chairman of the Exercise & Sport Program, that the Institute has found a home to start its resident-based coaching education programs.

New Institute Staff

In August, Mr. Lou Pullano joined the staff as our Youth Sports Coaching Consultant. Presently the Athletic Director at CCRI, Pullano is a member of the RI HS Soccer Coaches Hall of Fame and retired HS teacher and coach.

In June, Mr. Slava Heretz joined the staff to assist the Exec. Director with marketing research and business development issues. Heretz, a recent graduate of the sports management program at UMASS Amherst, has been developing the Institute's database of New Englandbased sports organizations.

IRS Non-Profit Status Update

In early September, Hickey received an update on the Institute's application for non-profit status from the IRS. The application is now awaiting its second review phase since it did not pass the first review. Historically,

75% of organizations that apply for non-profit status do not pass the first review. The IRS anticipates starting the second phase in early November and should rule on the Institute sometime

during the first quarter of 2006.

Fundraising Update

The Institute's first fundraising effort has been started; the shopping affiliates program.
